


Duane and Jean Morford

Duane grew up in three towns or rural communities across Kansas and one in southwestern Nebraska. Duane's father was a pastor and evangelist in the Evangelical Friends denomination. Duane attended Friends Bible College in Haviland, KS (now Barclay College) where he majored in Bible and Pastoral Methods with a minor in Music. Following his junior year he felt led to enter the business world rather than the ministry as he had originally planned. He retired from the insurance industry in December 2008.
