

When and how will I know if ROAM members want to work at my project?

ROAM Project Hosts will be notified via email when ROAM members place work requests for their projects.

Attached to an email with a work request is the ROAM Member's Skill Sheet which shows how they rate themselves on a number of skills needed in most camps, churches and other approved areas of service.

As the host, you do have the option to decline a request if you feel there is not a good fit. However, some who appear to have few professional skills can be excellent help when coupled with a skilled worker in a given area.

NOTE: Since ROAM members are allowed to choose where they would like to request to work, there are no guarantees when or how many ROAM members would be available to work at your location.

How do I Become a ROAM Project Host?

Complete an Application for Assistance which can be found at www.rvsonamission.org under the 'Projects' tab.

You may also be interested to review the ROAM Member Commitment Form to see what ROAM Members have agreed to and are expecting while working a ROAM Project.

When your application is received and approved by the ROAM office, the project information is placed on our list of active projects and published in our project list distributed to the members and on the ROAM website.

ROAM Volunteers Can Make a Difference For You



A Nazarene Lay Ministry

RVs on A Mission (ROAM) is an outreach ministry of the Church of the Nazarene that provides the opportunity for persons with an RV to volunteer their time and skills in meaningful Christian service through Church of the Nazarene related mission agencies, camps, churches, disaster relief, compassionate ministries projects, and other designated areas of service.

As a ROAM Project Host, what is expected of me?

Hosts provide RV parking on site or at a location near your facility at no cost to the ROAM volunteer.

Minimum requirements for RV parking are as follows:

- 50 amp electric preferred (30 amp minimum)
- Water
- Sewer hookup

Provide a 24-hour emergency telephone

Do ROAM Volunteers bring funds to help with supplies?

ROAM members are not expected to pay for any supplies for the project.

You must have money and any required permits on hand to do the project before you can be approved as a ROAM Project so that ROAMers can request to work at your location.

Is the host expected to carry insurance for the team?

No. ROAM members are required to carry their own insurance.

Who directs the work on the project?

The host designates someone from his organization to serve as Project Contact/Manager.

Must I furnish meals for the ROAM Members?

No, the host is not expected to furnish meals for the ROAMers.

Some locations may invite the team to eat a meal or two per day if they are already preparing a meal, but it is not mandatory.

Some ROAM projects will provide a get acquainted or appreciation meal but even these are not expected or mandatory.

What can I expect from the ROAM Members?

- ROAM members work on the tasks as outlined in the Application for Assistance.
- ROAM members typically begin work on the first Monday of the month and finish on the third Thursday, usually working Monday-Thursday.
- One ROAM member per RV works 6 hours and additional members per RV work 3 hours per day. Exact daily schedule is to be determined at the project.
- ROAM members may choose to work additional hours if needed, with Host's approval, but it is not required of them.
- At the Host's discretion, ROAM members may be able to stay a fourth week at no charge.
