The group leader recognizes the abilities of other team members and assigns them to tasks that are within their capabilities as shown on their ROAM Skill Sheet. The camaraderie of the team is a very important part of the project.

Membership

Membership is open to any person willing to support the purpose of the ROAM Ministry, agreeing to abide by the ROAM Mission Statement and Commitment, and professing to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

Each member is responsible for his/her own health and should advise the ROAM office of any limitations. It is advisable for you to have a current tetanus booster shot.

Each member must be financially independent and will not seek financial assistance from ROAM or any of its representatives.

ROAM has a \$40 annual membership fee, but operates largely on free will offerings; relying upon our Lord to supply all our needs. (Phil.4:19) Donations are gratefully accepted. Receipts will be issued annually.

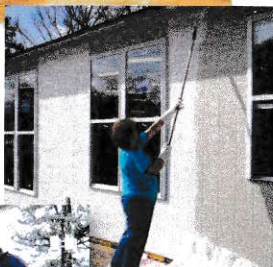

Each day a team member accepts the responsibility to lead the devotions with Bible reading, prayer, praises, requests for prayer, and singing.
